CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM ANNUAL REPORT FOR SY2018-19 & PLANS FOR SY2019-20

A. Educational Assistance Provided in SY2017-18

The school year 2018-19 has just ended. There were sixteen (16) students who were recipients of the educational assistance in partnership with LASTEN TULEVAISUUS. Seven (7) students were under K12 (elementary level), eight (8) scholars were Junior High School students, and one (1) student has completed college.

B. Mothers' Meeting

As agreed upon, there was a Mothers' Meeting every 1st and 3rd Fridays of the month. In this manner different issues were addressed immediately like the improvement of scholars' academic performance and behavioural aspects. During regular meetings, parenting was also discussed and the mothers were encouraged to let their children join Sunday school in their churches, school extra-curricular activities and other related activities which will help them improve their being.

C. Education and Monitoring of the Children

Details of students are the following:

1. Under Samaritana -12 Students
 - Eleven (11) K12 Pupils
 - One (1) College student
2. Under Youth with a Mission (YWAM) -4 Students
 - Three (3) K12 pupils (elementary)
 - One Junior High School

Aside from providing in-kind and in-cash assistance, they were also being monitored through home and school visitations once a quarter to check the progress and development of the sponsored children. In-kind assistance includes school supplies, bag, one set of school uniform/ Physical Education uniform, one pair of school shoes, and an umbrella/raincoat. In-cash assistance is in the form of a monthly allowance to help with transportation fare and/or lunch/snacks.

D. Christmas Party 2018



The 2018 Christmas Party was conducted at Samaritana's Multi-Purpose Hall. It was participated in by the CSP scholars, their families, and some of Samaritana's staff. Through the games, it was seen that everyone enjoyed the family bonding. With smiles on their faces, they gladly received their gifts, and some were lucky to win additional prizes in the raffle.

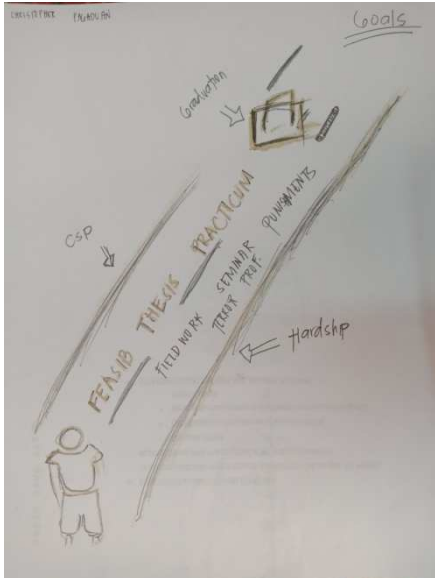
E. Recognition and Fellowship of the scholars

5. Dean's Lister- Christopher Pagaduan.

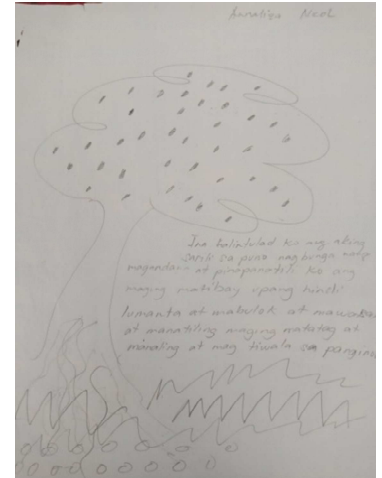

G. Children Who Dropped Out of the Scholarship Privilege

Previous report (2017-18) shows that there were nineteen (19) scholars. However, three (3) scholars discontinued.

- a) Delos Santos, Mar – he was emotionally unstable due to external factors such as school bullying that led him to discontinue his studies.
- b) Gonzales, Honey Kate – her mother stopped communicating with the Samaritana despite multiple attempts to follow-up
- c) Pagal, Kinnet – his mother did not continue her training at Samaritana which disqualified him for the assistance as stipulated in the CSP Policy

J. Review of Program Policies

The CSP Policies were revisited and revised in consultation with the mothers of the scholars. The following stipulations were included in the revision:

- a) Their own child is the priority for the scholarship program. If they do not have a child for scholarship, a sibling can be accommodated.
- b) Only one child is allowed to be in the scholarship however another child can be a beneficiary if the 1st child being applied for the scholarship achieved the average of 85% or higher.
- c) The scholars should join a small group like Sunday school, catechism, or values formation. There will be a deduction of Php1, 000.00 if there is no evidence of attendance.

The performance evaluation and monitoring of the scholars have been conducted through:

- a) Quarterly monitoring the report card of each scholar.
- b) Conduct of home visitation especially school visits to observe the progress of each child and provide feedback.

K. FUTURE PLANS

1. During home and school visitations one assigned woman leader should accompany the staff.
2. There will be a summer outing for the scholars, with one representative each scholar.
3. Revision of CSP Policy to include among others, a) clarity of prioritization of scholars to women's children and then to those who have no children; b) inclusion of the father, and not only the mother, to manifest interest; and c) addressing the mothers who are not anymore at Samaritana but are interested to have their children continue to access the scholarship program.
4. Strengthening of participation from concerned School and Church in monitoring the scholar's status or growth in classes.
5. Hiring of a new CSP Coordinator
